Overnight Docking

ALL DOCKING IS LOCATED CANALSIDE IN THE DOWNTOWN HARBOR OFF WATER STREET

- Please register at the Seneca Falls Museum & Tourism Center, 89 Fall Street, Seneca Falls. The center is located at ground level adjacent to the harbor.
- No Reservations required
- Docking is free - first come-first serve
- Free 48 hour hook-up at north and south sides of the canal
- Boaters must leave or move their boat after the 48 hour stay
- Please be considerate of others and have an enjoyable stay – Experience Seneca Falls!

Locks are open May thru September from 7:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m.

From Labor Day to the end of navigation season, the locks are open from 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

ERIE CANALWAY National Heritage Corridor

What is the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor?

The U.S. Congress recognized the Erie Canal's significance to our nation by establishing the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor in 2000. The Corridor spans 524 miles across the full expanse of the upstate New York. It includes the Erie, Cayuga-Seneca, Oswego, and Champlain Canals and their historic alignments. The Corridor encompasses 4,834 square miles in 23 counties and is home to 3.2 million people.

The Seneca Falls Harbor lies within the Cayuga-Seneca Canal and the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor.
